How can CaIVCB help?

- Victims who suffer physical injury or emotional injury due to the threat of physical injury may qualify for assistance.
- CaIVCB helps victims pay for expenses related to a crime that aren't covered by any other source.
- Once an application is allowed, victims are eligible for assistance up to \$70,000. Some benefit limits may apply.

Who is eligible?

CaIVCB can help victims and their families when the crime happens in California, or when a crime happens to a California resident in another state or country. United States citizenship is not required to apply.

Victims can submit an application within seven years of the crime, or seven years after the victim knew or discovered that an injury or death occurred because of the crime. Victims who are 21 years old or younger have until their 28th birthday to apply.
