The California Victim Compensation Board (CalVCB) helps victims of crime, including domestic violence.

Domestic Violence means abuse committed against someone in a relationship or former relationship.

Minors who are children of the victim and live in the same home may qualify. They have until their 28th birthday to apply.

How CalVCB Can Help

- CalVCB helps victims pay for expenses related to a crime that aren't covered by any other source.
- If approved, victims may receive up to \$70,000 for crime-related expenses. Some benefit limits may apply.

Documentation Accepted for Domestic Violence Victims

A crime report is NOT required.

CalVCB will also accept:

- A report on official letterhead from a domestic violence program.
- Medical records that document injuries consistent with domestic violence.
- Mental health treatment records.
- Evidence the perpetrator was/is enrolled in a domestic violence program.
- Restraining orders, criminal protective order, or emergency protective order.
