

The California Victim Compensation Board (CalVCB) helps victims of violent crimes, **including human trafficking**, by reimbursing them for crime-related expenses. Victims may receive up to \$70,000 in total compensation.

Human trafficking happens when someone takes away another person's freedom to make them **work** or perform **sex acts**. This can happen through violence, threats, or force. Sometimes this is also referred to as **labor trafficking** or **sex trafficking**.

Human Trafficking Compensation

Human trafficking victims can get up to \$10,000 per year, for up to two years, if a trafficker kept them from their freedom. To apply, victims must also complete the wage verification form.

Minor victims will receive the money after they turn 18.

Documentation Accepted

Victims will need to give CalVCB proof the crime happened. An application cannot be denied only because the victim did not file a police report.

CalVCB accepts other types of proof, including but not limited to:

- A letter from law enforcement
- A signed statement from a human trafficking caseworker
- Documents from a government agency for a special visa
- Medical records

How to Apply

Victims have seven years from the date of the crime to apply. Victims who are 21 years old and younger have until their 28th birthday to apply.
